HOW TO RECYCLE at Carling and Killbear Waste Sites

BLUE BOX FOR CONTAINERS

Metal Beverage and Food Cans

Glass Bottles and Jars

Clear and coloured beverage and food containers
(there is no need to separate coloured and clear jars)

Plastic Containers

Bottles, trays, tubs, lids, and film (Look for triangle
symbol on the bottom)

Rigid Plastic Bottles

Antifreeze, windshield washer, milk jugs, fabric
softener and bleach bottles

Mixed Plastics

Margarine, ice cream, yogurt, ketchup, peanut butter
and shampoo bottles

Plastic Film

Store plastic bags in another plastic bag, tie and place
in blue box

Aluminum Trays and Foil

Empty Paint & Stain Cans

Scrape dry, remove lid, place can and lid in blue box

Empty Aerosol Cans

BLUE BOX FOR FIBRES

Kraft Paper Bags

Newspapers

Including advertising inserts and glossy flyers

Magazines, Catalogues & Telephone books

Boxboard & Waxed Boxboard (break down)

Cereal, detergent, shoe boxes Kleenex and cardboard
tubes

Fiber Egg Cartons

Mixed and Office Papers

Household paper, junk mail, writing and computer
paper, envelopes, greeting cards & gift wrap

Hard & Soft covered books

Corrugated Cardboard

Layered cardboard boxes with a ripple between the
layers

Juice Drink Boxes and Tetra Packs

Boxes that are NOT lined with foil are acceptable

Polycoat Milk and Juice Cartons

Styrofoam

Food Styrofoam is acceptable, packaging Styrofoam is
not

Fast Food Containers

Coffee and soft drink cups and lids (put lids inside
cup), drink trays, fiber food wrapping and boxes
(ensure no food remains in packaging)

Recycling is **MANDATORY** in Carling Township. Place all materials in a container designed so that the contents are clearly visible. If you choose not to use a blue box, material must be in a transparent bag. Personal items may be placed in an opaque bag inside a transparent bag.

* Please check all your plastic containers for the triangle symbol with a number inside, typically #1-7. These numbers represent the resin content in the container. Carling accepts plastics #1-7. Try to choose products with these numbers when shopping in order to make more of a difference in our environment.
